

4.0. Matters Arising for this Meeting.

4.1. Christmas Tree and Lights. Carols round the Tree.

The parish council has authorised the chair of the council to buy extra lights for the tree. The amount to be spent is no more than £50.00. Lady Bell has stated that the parish council may have a tree as long as we have someone who has a chainsaw licence, and there must be two people on site when the tree is cut. The parish council will look at trees to see which one is suitable. It has been decided that Carols round the Tree will take place on the 18th December at 7.00pm. There will be Mulled Wine and Mince-pies in the Village Hall. With the parish council meeting straight afterwards at 8.00pm.

4.2. Village Name Signs.

The parish council are looking into grants and funding to improve the appearance of the villages, these will include new name signs for the villages and tubs filled with flowers around the villages.

4.3. Parish Emergency Plan.

The parish council are looking into producing an emergency plan for any eventuality. It was suggested a list of volunteers be put in place so that everyone knows who to contact.
