Community Plan (formerly Parish Plan)

The Steering Group of volunteers has now compiled the main questionnaire by which it hopes to gauge residents' opinions on five key areas of life in Ingleby Arncliffe Parish. The questions are based on responses to the Pre-Questionnaire circulated in April and drafted with the help and guidance of Peter Cole, Business and Community Officer from Hambleton District Council and Frances Bainbridge, Business and Community Consultation Officer.

Parish residents, families from the wider community and children from the village school should all have received a questionnaire and the Steering Group hopes that everyone will take a few minutes to answer the questions and make appropriate comments. It is most important that any Community Plan produced from the answers to the questionnaire reflects the overriding wishes of the whole community, so the more responses received the better.

Completed questionnaires may be returned to Alma Fox, George Hunter, Ian Heseltine, Joyce Bean, Venetia Bell, Allan Jensen, Ruth Eastham or Hazel Warhurst - or brought to an informal Open Evening in Ingleby Cross Village Hall on **Friday 6th July**. Wine, coffee, tea and nibbles will be available all evening, so please come along any time **between 6 pm and 8 pm** and hand in your form.

Members of the Steering Group will be there, together with officers from Hambleton District Council and other organisations who can give information on broadband, digital switchover, affordable housing, renewable energy, litter picking and security.

Jill Libby

For those who do not know the details, Jill Libby was accidentally injured on Thursday 21st June while standing at a junction with her bicycle waiting for traffic to pass before she set off again on to the A172 near Swainby. Two cars collided and one of them went on to hit Jill causing multiple fractures to an arm, her ribs and serious bruising of the lungs. She hopes to be discharged from hospital this week but recovery will be slow and very painful. We send her our best wishes.

Parish Council Finances

The Parish precept for last year was £4600. Grass cutting costs of more than £2800 were exceptionally high in 2011-2012 - three times the figure paid in previous years. Out of that money £500 was the cost of cutting and strimming the Recreation Area. The premium paid for Insurance liabilities of all the Parish Assets was £1200, and those two categories together with the Clerk's salary took us well over budget. As we are required to build up reserves in case we have to call an election in between District Council elections we were left with no alternative but to increase the precept again this year.

Following the Village Sports Day last September the Parish Council received the profit (£518) from the event and a further £500 from IVRA funds towards insuring the play equipment. The contribution from the Annual Sports Day was very welcome and any profit made in future will continue to help fund the day to day costs of maintaining the Recreation Area. Better terms recently negotiated with a different Insurance Company will ease the situation in the current financial year. As detailed on the two notice-boards the Parish Council Finance books will be available for inspection following audit,

Recycling at Ingleby Arncliffe Primary School

There are two large containers in the school car park for your convenience. One is for **Newspapers, magazines** and general waste **paper**; the other is for **Cans** of any shape or size – preferably squashed.

Please note that the Can Bank is for Cans only.

Unfortunately, someone has been dumping plastic carrier bags containing assorted plastic waste in amongst the cans, and there are also plastic bags full of cans in there as well. This contamination may mean that the school does not get the money from the Recycling Company to which they are entitled. Please respect the notice on the Can Bank and take your carrier bags home, or put them in the waste bin near the Parish Notice-board in front of the Methodist Chapel.

Oil Co-operative

Ingleby Villages Oil Group is part of the Osmotherley and surrounding villages Oil Co-Operative. Started in September 2011 with 17 members, the Ingleby group now has 51 members, ordering almost 20,000 litres of oil every 2 months. The saving is on average 5p per litre ex VAT, which amounts to £25 on 500 litres of oil - £50 on 1,000 litres. A total of 73,800 litres have been ordered by Ingleby group this year – a massive saving of £3,690

Anyone in Ingleby Cross, Ingleby Arncliffe or the surrounding area can join, the more the merrier!

How it works.

- Members should email or telephone Jude Temple with their order requirements by the set dates.
- The Osmotherley Co-ordinator obtains prices from various suppliers, based on the total volume, and places orders on behalf of members.
- Members are then informed of the supplier's details and price per litre plus the anticipated delivery date.
- The supplier leaves or sends an individual invoice for each delivery.
- You are responsible for the payment of your invoice – ideally within 14 days.

THE CO-ORDINATOR DOES NOT HANDLE ANY MONEY.

- If you don't have email then ask someone with email to 'buddy up' with you so they can email the Co-ordinator on your behalf.
- Members are under no obligation to order each time the orders are made.

Street Parking

We are currently experiencing problems on the Main Street in Ingleby Arncliffe. It is always difficult if a lot of visitors come at the same time so it would be helpful if parking could be kept to **one side of the street only**. The road needs to be kept clear for a number of reasons. Atkinson's coaches require access 24 hours a day and the drivers have had to waken residents during the night to be able to get their coaches in or out of the depot. Some large delivery vehicles are also encountering difficulty coming through this section of the village and this could be serious if one of the emergency services were to be held up on an urgent call to a resident.

Extra cars may be parked in the bay in front of the village school, at right angles to the kerb, so long as consideration is given to parents delivering or collecting children at school times.
