2. Minutes of Last Meeting.

3. Opportunity for Public to Speak.

Police Report. Neighbourhood Watch.

2/10/14. Report raising concerns about two dogs that are regularly walked without lead. Officers attended and spoke with owner who has been advised to keep his dogs on leads when walking through the village

07/10/14. Report of 4 males in the area selling fish. Vehicle registration circulated and this vehicle was previously checked on 14th August and was found to be in order. This is still Cold Calling. And has been reported to Trading Standards.

County Councillor Bryn Griffiths mentioned that there was about to be an announcement about the future of the Library Services. District Councillor David Hugill said the A Good Neighbourhoods Scheme was operating in Stokesley which might be something Ingleby Arncliffe could introduce.

4. Matters Arising from Last Month's Meeting.

4.1. Neighbourhood Plan.

There has been a relaxation in planning rules to allow a 5% development in some of the smaller settlements. It is not yet known if this would be applicable to our villages, but in any case the wishes of a Neighbourhood Plan would be dominant. It was decided to have a Consultation Evening led by Councillor Les Sutton- Haigh. The intention is for it to be an enjoyable event where people can express their views about a Neighbourhood Plan. A representative from Hambleton District Council Planning dept may attend. The date set is Wednesday 18th November at 7.00 pm in the Village Hall.

4.2. Defibrillator.

The parish council has decided to go ahead with the purchase of the Defibrillator and will advance the money pending donations being collected. This will cost in the region of £1,500. Jude Temple will contact John Darley to check that a free cabinet is available for us.
