THE defibrillator is now in place at the village hall. There was a demonstration in the village hall on Saturday, February 14, from 11am by Dave Jones of the Yorkshire Ambulance Service. People were shown how to use the defibrillator. This was an information session of about 1½ hours for all the members of the community and there was an opportunity to ask questions. There was no attempt to get people to sign up as a first responder as there

are no plans for this sort of scheme. There were also tea and biscuits available. A plaque is to be made recording donations.
