We thank the volunteers who have made it known that they are willing to help us with the Neighbourhood Plan in the spring when we can apply for a grant and start our own consultation process.



#### **Neighbourhood Watch -** Advice from North Yorkshire Police

**Cybercrime** is a real threat across the UK, including in North Yorkshire. Since 1 April 2015, 624 cyber-related incidents were reported to North Yorkshire Police, ranging from online bullying and Child Sexual Exploitation to holiday fraud and identity theft.

Take measures to secure all mobile devices, against thieves, hackers and online criminals. Install anti-virus scanners and malware removal software. For phones and tablets, tracking devices are really important.

Anyone going online should think carefully about the information they are publishing. Modern day criminals have the technology and ingenuity to piece together data and personal information in order to target you via the internet. Don't publish anything that could threaten your personal security and safety.

**Beware of courier scams -** such as have been in Ruislip, London, where a resident received a phone call from a fake 'courier' company saying a parcel was on its way. On arrival, the recipient was asked to pay a small delivery charge by credit or debit card. Unknown to them, the handheld machine was used to clone their card and later to withdraw a large amount of money from various cash machines.

Be wary of accepting any surprise gift or package, which you neither expected nor personally ordered, especially if it involves any kind of payment as a condition of receiving the gift or package. Never accept anything if you do not personally know, or there is no proper identification of the sender.
