

	 Beyond have now gone back out to the market to find another Groundworker, 	
	which to date they have not been successful in doing so, due to significant price increases across the board.	
	 Beyond remain 100% committed to the scheme but must put all work on hold until a solution can be found. 	
	 Homes England have been approached for additional funding and a decision from them is due by the end of the financial year. 	
	 North Yorkshire Local Enterprise Partnership have also been approached for either 'Brownfield' funding or 'Zero-carbon' developments, but a decision on this will take a longer timescale. 	
	 BB does not expect there to be any change to the tenure of the proposed housing.
